From the Priest-in-Residence

BLESSED JOHN HENRY NEWMAN

Last Thursday, October 9th, was the feast day of Bl John Henry Newman, who is one of the patrons of the Brisbane Oratory in Formation.

He was the 19th-century's most important English-speaking Roman Catholic theologian and spent the first half of his life as an Anglican and the second half as a Roman Catholic. He was a priest, popular preacher, writer, and eminent theologian in both Churches.

Born in London in 1801, he studied at Oxford's Trinity College. He was a tutor at Oriel College, Oxford, and for 17 years was vicar of the university church, St. Mary the Virgin, at Oxford. He eventually published eight volumes of *Parochial and Plain Sermons* as well as two novels. His poem, "Dream of Gerontius," was set to music by Sir Edward Elgar.

After 1833, Newman was a prominent member of the Oxford Movement, which emphasised the Church's debt to the early Church Fathers and challenged any tendency to consider truth as completely subjective.

Historical research convinced Newman that the Roman Catholic Church was in continuity with and was the Church that Jesus established. In 1845, he was received into full communion as a Catholic. Two years later he was ordained a Catholic priest in Rome. While in Rome he came to know the Congregation of the Oratory, founded three centuries earlier by St. Philip Neri. Returning to England, Newman founded Oratory houses in Birmingham and later in London and for seven years served as rector of the Catholic University of Ireland.

Newman eventually wrote 40 books and 21,000 letters that survive. Most famous are his book-length *Essay on the Development of Christian Doctrine*, *On Consulting the Faithful in Matters of Doctrine*, *Apologia Pro Vita Sua* (his spiritual autobiography up to 1864) and *Essay on the Grammar of Assent*.

When Newman was named a cardinal in 1879, he took as his motto "*Cor ad cor loquitur*" (Heart speaks to heart). He was buried in Rednal (near Birmingham) 11 years later. After his grave was exhumed in 2008, a new tomb was prepared at the Oratory Church in Birmingham.

Pope Benedict XVI beatified Newman on September 19, 2010, at Crofton Park (near Birmingham). This was an unusual step to have the Pope beatify someone and not to have the ceremony in Rome. The Holy Father noted Newman's emphasis on the vital place of revealed religion in civilized society but also praised his pastoral zeal for the sick, the poor, the bereaved and those in prison.

John Henry Newman has been called the "absent Father of Vatican II" because his writings on conscience, religious liberty, Scripture, the vocation of lay people, the relation of Church and State, and other topics were extremely influential in the shaping of the Council's documents.

Among many sayings and writings most well known are the words of the hymns "Firmly I believe and truly", "Praise to the Holiest in the Height" and "Lead Kindly Light".

The following is also well-known among Newman's writings:

God has created me to do Him some definite service. He has committed some work to me, which He has not committed to another. I have my mission. I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good; I shall do His work. I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it if I do but keep His commandments. Therefore, I will trust Him, whatever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him, in perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him. If I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. He does nothing in vain. He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends. He may throw me among strangers. He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide my future from me. Still, He knows what He is about.
