From the Parish Priest

Dear Parishioners,

You will notice in Mary Immaculate church the ambo (lectern) has been transferred to the other side of the sanctuary. This is to make space for a Marian devotional area in front of Our Lady's statue and painting. A votive candle stand and kneelers are now in place. The candle stand will be operational soon and will then be blessed. It is highly appropriate that Mary Immaculate church, dedicated to Our Lady, will once again have a dedicated area in the church where we can seek her powerful intercessions and protection for ourselves and all those we love, and indeed to pray for the needs of whole world. On a similar theme, Tuesday 24th May is the Solemnity of Our Lady Help of Christians, patroness of Australia and of the Brisbane Oratory in Formation. Mass that day will be at 7:00am [EF] and 10:15am [OF+]. All the children from Mary Immaculate School will be present for this 10:15am Mass. There will also be a sung [EF] Mass at 6:30pm that evening at St Columba's church, Wilston.

As mentioned last week, the Brisbane Oratory in Formation will have its first anniversary on May 26th - the feast day of our founder St Philip Neri. **On that day, Thursday, May 26th, there will be a Solemn High Mass in thanksgiving at 7:00pm in Mary Immaculate church.** Afterwards there will be a light supper in Marymac Centre. Everyone is warmly invited to be present with all of the Oratory Fathers and our four seminarians who will also be with us at that time. **Adoration at St Elizabeth's will commence at 10:00pm on that day to allow all to attend the Brisbane Oratory in Formation's Anniversary celebrations.**

Finally, we are progressing in our project to reinstall beautiful marble communion rails in Mary Immaculate church. For our reflection this week we have a beautiful prayer to the Holy Spirit for this special solemnity of Pentecost Sunday today. It was written by Désiré-Joseph Cardinal Mercier (1851-1926). Cardinal Mercier wrote this prayer on the back of a holy picture while on pilgrimage at the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham in England. In 1926, while preaching a retreat, he offered a little commentary on it:

I am going to reveal to you a secret of holiness and of happiness. Every day for five minutes, silence your imagination, closing your eyes to things of the senses and your ears to all earthly sounds so as to withdraw into yourselves, and there in the sanctuary of your baptized soul, which is the temple of the Holy Spirit, speak to that Divine Spirit, saying:

Holy Spirit, soul of my soul, I adore Thee;

enlighten, guide, strengthen and console me;

tell me what I ought to do and command me to do it,

I promise to be submissive in everything that Thou shalt ask of me

and to accept all that Thou permittest to happen to me,

only show me what is Thy will.

Cardinal Mercier said: If you do this, your life will flow along in happiness, serenity, and consolation, even in the midst of sorrows, because grace will be proportioned to your trials, giving you the strength to bear them, and you will arrive at the gates of Paradise laden with merits. This submission to the Holy Spirit is the secret of holiness.

SUNDAY MASS READINGS

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading: Romans 8:8-17

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live. Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!'

The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.
