From the Parish Priest

Dear Parishioners,

This week I have a few different items of news for you.

Finally, at long last the newly repaired stained glass windows of Mary Immaculate Church will be refitted next week and into the following week. It will be marvellous to have the storm repair work finally completed.

Every 5 years, coinciding with the national census, an Australia wide Mass count is taken over 4 consecutive weekends. This will begin next weekend 30/4 – 1/5. Collectors at Mass are asked to conduct the count on each side of the church during the 1st collection and confirm the count during the second collection over the four weekends. (Please remember not to forget the choir and small children). A short form will be provided for the collectors to fill out after the second collection and leave in the collections bag so that it will then find its way to the Parish office. If collectors have any queries about this procedure please speak with the priest at Mass for clarification.

All Parish groups are asked to be aware that there is a new system now in place for booking Mary Immaculate hall for parish events. Please contact the Parish office for details if you wish to book the hall at any stage.

Finally, the Pastoral Care department at Greenslopes Hospital are seeking additional Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. If any of our commissioned Extraordinary Ministers wish to volunteer, please contact Fr Wise through the Parish Office.

FROM AMORIS LAETITIA CHAPTER 3

“The gospel of the family spans the history of the world, from the creation of man and woman in the image and likeness of God (cf. Gen1:26-27), to the fulfillment of the mystery of the covenant in Christ at the end of time with the marriage of the Lamb (cf. Rev 19:9)”. The covenant of love and fidelity lived by the Holy Family of Nazareth illuminates the principle which gives shape to every family, and enables it better to face the vicissitudes of life and history. On this basis, every family, despite its weaknesses, can become a light in the darkness of the world. ‘Nazareth teaches us the meaning of family life, its loving communion, its simple and austere beauty, its sacred and inviolable character. May it teach how sweet and irreplaceable is its training, how fundamental and incomparable its role in the social order’ (Paul VI, *Address in Nazareth* 5 January 1964)”.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

The sacrament of marriage is not a social convention, an empty ritual or merely the outward sign of a commitment. The sacrament is a gift given for the sanctification and salvation of the spouses, since “their mutual belonging is a real representation, through the sacramental sign, of the same relationship between Christ and the Church. The married couple are therefore a permanent reminder for the church of what took place on the cross; they are for one another and for their children witnesses of the salvation in which they share through the sacrament”. Marriage is a vocation, inasmuch as it is a response to a specific call to experience conjugal love as an imperfect sign of the love between Christ and the Church. Consequently, the decision to marry and to have a family ought to be the fruit of a process of vocational discernment.

(From Page 1) "Mutual self-giving in the sacrament of matrimony is grounded in the grace of baptism, which establishes the foundational covenant of every person with Christ in the Church. In accepting each other, and with Christ's grace, the engaged couple promise each other total self-giving, faithfulness and openness to new life. The couple recognizes these elements as constitutive of marriage, gifts offered to them by God, and take seriously their mutual commitment, in God's name and in the presence of the Church. Faith thus makes it possible for them to assume the goods of marriage as commitments that can be better kept through the help of the grace of the sacrament... Consequently, the Church looks to married couples as the heart of the entire family, which in turn looks to Jesus". The sacrament is not a "thing" or a "power", for in it Christ himself "now encounters Christian spouses... He dwells with them, gives them the strength to take up their crosses and so follow Him to rise again after they have fallen, to forgive one another and to bear one another's burdens.

SUNDAY MASS READINGS

First Reading: Acts 14:21-27

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.
