From the Parish Priest

Dear Parishioners,

This is my first time writing to you about Parish finances and Planned Giving. I do so because the new sets of Planned Giving envelopes for the next year will be issued next weekend and this provides a good opportunity for me to sincerely thank you in Jesus' name for your marvellous spirit of generosity in supporting the Parish financially. I don't particularly relish speaking about money issues in the parish and I will do so only when necessary. Thankfully, I haven't really needed to speak about finances much because of your evident and praiseworthy commitment to provide for the temporal needs of our parish. Together let's continue to generously support God's work in Christ through Annerley Ekibin Parish.

God is the source of every blessing in our lives; His constant generosity to us through Christ his Son is more than we can ever know or imagine. We are called to lovingly and joyfully give back to God for all His goodness to us by giving of our "time, talent and treasure".

Time

Time is one gift that God has given all of us, with the freedom to choose how we use it. Our time offered in prayer, with family and friends, at Church through Mass and the Sacraments, in volunteering, and in coming along to events is so valuable to our Parish life. In today's ever-busy world, sharing what time we can to help others through the Church, is a precious gift.

Talent

God has blessed each of us with special gifts, skills and talents, which we are encouraged to share with our Parish community. Our Parish could grow so much more from the talents and gifts each of us have being shared more readily and courageously. Many in our Parish do this with great generosity. The Lord is calling many others to also step up and do the same with a joyful and faithfilled heart.

Treasure

Our Parish survives only on what Parishioners give. For example, your regular financial giving opens the Church doors, pays the electricity bills and supports the ministry work we do in Christ. But we want to do more. A vibrant community reflects the faith of the people within. By sharing our financial resources our Parish community can continue to grow and develop and be maintained. We don't all have the same financial resources. However equal sacrifice comes through each of us giving in proportion to what we have. This is the shared responsibility before God of ALL of us in the Parish.

In these more difficult economic times please make our Parish your first "charity of choice". If you are not contributing to our Planned Giving program I appeal to you to please begin from next week by filling out a form to join the program to help provide the Parish with a regular, reliable income.

My own approach as Parish Priest to Parish financial management is to be naturally prudent and careful in financial decision making, in consultation with our talented Parish Finance Council. At the same time I believe that funds should not simply continue to accumulate once adequate Parish savings are secured and maintained. Because of your continuing generosity, and the fact that we have some unexpected income at the moment, we have been able to carry out some necessary maintenance on St John Fisher Church and carry out some major projects at Mary Immaculate Church. It is interesting to note that Parishioners may greatly support one particular project but not another. For example some people may be very enthusiastic about the installation of communion rails but not supportive of air conditioning in the church; for others it is the exact opposite, they have no time for communion rails but are keen for A/C to be installed in the church. I suppose our Parish family is like any other family, some things meet with our approval while other things do not, but we always remain committed and loyal to our families. All these projects are ultimately for the glory of God and for the good of our community.

SUNDAY MASS READINGS

First Reading: 1Kings 19:16.19-21

The Lord said to Elijah: 'Go, you are to anoint Elisha son of Shaphat, of Abel Meholah, as prophet to succeed you.' Leaving there, Elijah came on Elisha son of Shaphat as he was ploughing behind twelve yoke of oxen, he himself being with the twelfth. Elijah passed near to him and threw his cloak over him. Elisha left his oxen and ran after Elijah. 'Let me kiss my father and mother, then I will follow you' he said. Elijah answered, 'Go, go back; for have I done anything to you?' Elisha turned away, took the pair of oxen and slaughtered them. He used the plough for cooking the oxen, then gave to his men, who ate. He then rose, and followed Elijah and became his servant.

Second Reading: Galatians 5: 1, 13-18

When Christ freed us, he meant us to remain free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery.

My brothers, you were called, as you know, to liberty; but be careful, or this liberty will provide an opening for self-indulgence. Serve one another, rather, in works of love, since the whole of the Law is summarised in a single command: Love your neighbour as yourself. If you go snapping at each other and tearing each other to pieces, you had better watch or you will destroy the whole community.

Let me put it like this: if you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions.

If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you.

As the time drew near for him to be taken up to heaven, he resolutely took the road for Jerusalem and sent messengers ahead of him. These set out, and they went into a Samaritan village to make preparations for him, but the people would not receive him because he was making for Jerusalem. Seeing this, the disciples James and John said, 'Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to burn them up?' But he turned and rebuked them, and they went off to another village.

As they travelled along they met a man on the road who said to him, 'I will follow you wherever you go'. Jesus answered, 'Foxes have holes and the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head'.
