An epiphany on the Epiphany by Alejandro Teran-Somohano



In our everyday lives, we use the word 'epiphany' to mean a sudden realization about something. If I am stuck trying to solve a certain problem and the answer suddenly appears in my mind as if by divine inspiration, I would say: "I just had an epiphany." However, that is not the only meaning of the word. 'Epiphany' originally meant 'manifestation' or 'revelation'. Both meanings are related, of course, because in order for a revelation to be a revelation, it requires that someone receive it. You must reveal something to someone. A revelation to no one is, well, not a revelation at all. Furthermore, the recipient of a revelation must become aware of that revelation, he must realize that something is being revealed to him. Therefore, both meanings of the word 'epiphany' go hand in hand. They are, so to speak, two sides of the same coin.

This brief introduction is meant to set up my main point about the feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord, which we are celebrating this Sunday. That is, that in response to God's Epiphany, we ought to have an epiphany of our own. Let us go back to our two meanings of the word 'epiphany'. When the Church speaks of the "Epiphany of Our Lord", she is speaking according to the second meaning I presented. She is referring to Christ's first revelation to the world of who He is. The infinite God has manifested Himself in Bethlehem; He has shown His face to the whole world in the face of the infant Jesus and the Magi are there to witness it.

The first meaning is also present in the story of the Magi. The Magi have seen a star, which they recognize as a sign of the birth of a king. What matters, however, is that they come to realize that it is not the birth of an ordinary king that this star is heralding. By having a personal epiphany, they become aware of whom this king truly is. And hence the gifts they bear: gold for a king, frankincense for a god, and myrrh for a suffering redeemer. Most importantly, however, is that their encounter with Christ is a transforming encounter.

Scripture hints at this by saying that they went back to their homes following a different path, or, as Archbishop Fulton Sheen put it: "No one who ever meets Christ with a good will returns the same way as he came."

From Page 1: In the feast of the Epiphany, we ought to have our personal epiphany in which we become aware of who Christ is. He is God Incarnate. He is the Word made flesh. We have become so familiar with the story of Christmas and the story of the Magi that we have forgotten what it actually means. We have grown used to hearing Christ say: "Before Abraham was, I AM" that we no longer see the implications of that claim. In a few words, we have lost sight of the fact that the Epiphany is about coming to grips with the fact that the child wrapped in swaddling clothes is God.

The implications of all this are as follows: either you accept Christ to be who he claimed to be, or you utterly and absolutely reject Him. There is no middle ground. Thomas Jefferson's idea of Christ as just a good moral teacher is rubbish. As Chesterton said: "It is possible to find here and there human beings who make this supremely superhuman claim. It is possible to find them in lunatic asylums, [...] nobody supposes that Jesus of Nazareth was that sort of person." Either he was who He said He was or He was insane. C.S. Lewis would later add to these possibilities that of Him being a liar, in which case it is impossible for Him to be a good moral teacher. Therefore, the decision remains the same. And that leads us to what, I believe, is the whole point of the Epiphany.

Epiphany is a time of decision, a moment in which we must define whether we embrace Christ and accept that He is who He said He is and surrender our entire lives to Him, or we stand in open defiance of Him. If you are not going to take a stance, you might as well openly defy Him. Non-definition is a lukewarm response and we know that Christ does not favour the lukewarm, to say the least! [see Rev. 3: 16-22].

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem.

He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him 'for this is what the prophet wrote: And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.' Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.
