Dear Parishioners,

Since we hear from Second Corinthians in the readings this week, in which St Paul asks for contributions towards a collection for the Church in Jerusalem, it seems fitting to consider our Parish giving.

First, a warm thank you to all who already give on a regular Planned Giving basis which provides a steady income crucial for parish planning, and also to those who, for various reasons, choose to give *ad hoc*. Your giving is invaluable to supporting the ongoing needs of the Parish; and a reminder that many Planned Giving envelopes are still at the rear of the churches awaiting Collection.

At this time of new envelopes I would like to take the opportunity to ask all parishioners to reconsider the option of giving to the parish via **Electronic Funds Transfer**. This "set and forget" arrangement is very suited to our busy lifestyles. It also ensures that the parish receives the amount committed to, cuts down on time spent administering funds, and alleviates the workload of our volunteer counters. This can easily be done via signing up with the Archdiocese fund (*requiring a simple form to set up and amend*) or you can organise via your own internet banking by setting up an ongoing weekly (*or other interval of your choice*) payment. You then have the capability of full self-management which can be amended at any time. The account details for this latter arrangement are as follows. Please also consider inflation. As we all know from experience running households, each year bills increase, and the parish is not immune to this. Accordingly, I ask you to consider increasing your giving by CPI each year (average is about 2%). As an example, goods costing \$1000 in 2010 would now cost \$1156.87 (<https://www.rba.gov.au/calculator/annualDecimal.html>). Parishes can often struggle under rising costs while giving remains at the same level. So, if you would kindly take this reality into account, our parish would benefit greatly. Thank you.

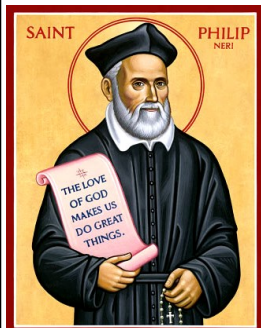

Responsorial Psalm 29

(Said by all)

I will praise you, Lord, you have rescued me and have not let my enemies rejoice over me. O Lord, you have raised my soul from the dead, restored me to life from those who sink into the grave.

Sing psalms to the Lord, you who love him, give thanks to his holy name. His anger lasts but a moment; his favour through life. At night there are tears, but joy comes with dawn.

Second Reading: *2 Corinthians 8: 7, 9, 13,-15*

You always have the most of everything - of faith, of eloquence, of understanding, of keenness for any cause, and the biggest share of our affection - so we expect you to put the most into this work of mercy too. Remember how generous the Lord Jesus was: he was rich, but he became poor for your sake, to make you rich out of his poverty. This does not mean that to give relief to others you ought to make things difficult for yourselves: it is a question of balancing what happens to your surplus now against their present need, and one day they may have something to spare that will supply your own need. That is how we strike a balance; as scripture says: The man who gathered much had none too much, the man who gathered little did not go short.

Gospel: *Mark 5:21-43*

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus went with him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all around him.

While he was still speaking some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?'

But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John, the brother of James.

So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kum!' which means, 'Little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.
