The spiritual Fathers used the image of sleep to depict the state of the sinful person who sinks into a dreamy state of self-deception. If this sinful state persists it ends in the full incapacitation of the person towards the good, and the lack of will to do what is right. "Stay awake and pray that you may not enter into the time of trial." (Mt 26:41) In the evening before retiring we should perform a prayer practice called the examination of conscience. It consists in reviewing the day through God's eyes, to see events them as they really are, in truth. This transfers the events of the day from the memory to the conscience and allows us to evaluate them by God's measure. The great blessing of a prayerful examination of conscience is self-knowledge. We start paying attention to what we are doing, saying and thinking. At the same time we become aware of our deficiencies without self-justification. Another fruit of prayerful examination of conscience is the grace to forgive 'those who trespass against us', and to find inner peace.

First Reading: *Numbers 11:25-29*

The Lord came down in the Cloud. He spoke with Moses, but took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. When the spirit came on them they prophesied, but not again.

Two men had stayed back in the camp: one was called Eldad and the other Medad. The spirit came down on them; though they had not gone to the Tent, their names were enrolled among the rest. These began to prophesy in the camp. The young man ran to tell this to Moses, "Look," he said "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp. " Then said Joshua the Son of Nun, who had served Moses from his youth, "My Lord Moses, stop them!" Moses answered him, "Are you jealous on my account? John said to Jesus, "Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name; and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him." But Jesus said, "You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us. If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.

But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out!"
