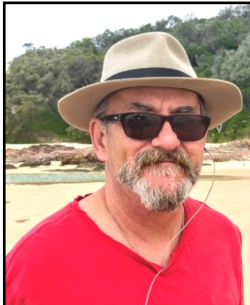

WORLD ROSARY

Countries around the world are joining to hold Rosary Rallies across the world on 7th October, the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. Together we are calling upon God, through the powerful intercession of Our Lady of the Rosary and praying for our world and countries. There are now over 40 Nations.

Australia has close to 180 locations so far including 84 schools which participated last week. Locations and times can be found at the 'Oz Rosary' website below.

The event has wide ecclesial approval and a rally will take place in Rome at St Peter's Square on Sunday as well. Pope Francis has called on Catholics to pray the rosary this October for the Church.

The World Rosary started with a '54-day Novena' on 15th August (Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary) until the feast of the Holy Rosary on the 7th October. Each nation has been asked to pray for its own intentions on the day.

Australia will start first on Sunday the 7th Of October and 'light the match'! Countries involved include USA, Poland, UK, Ireland, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Nigeria, Zimbabwe, Lebanon, Holy Land, Russia, Denmark's, India, Mexico, Panama, France, Belgium, Italy, and the Philippines.

Australian intentions for the world rosary will be family, rekindling of faith and continued Godly protection.

“Spirituality of the Heart: The heart is the sanctuary of the human being, where one stands before the face of God. The heart constitutes the very essence of a person, the "place" where one assumes responsibility or opens or closes the self to God's actions. The heart is also the seat of the will. God tests the mind and searches the heart. In God, we come to recognise ourselves and contemplate the depths of our own hearts. Conscience (to know jointly) involves not so much the knowledge held by an individual, or some kind of "subjective truth", but *joint knowledge* with the Divine Persons for the purpose of *joint action* with Them. Right conscience is the most important factor in a person's being. By internal watchfulness or attentiveness, the "guarding of the heart", one cultivates the field of the heart to ensure the seed of the enemy does enter therein. Being attentive to the heart is first and foremost about dismissing evil thoughts and guarding the heart with sensitivity.”

MASS READINGS

First Reading: *Genesis 2:18-24*

The Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone. I will make him a helpmate." So from the soil the Lord God fashioned all the wild beasts and all the birds of heaven. These he brought to the man to see what he would call them; each one was to bear the name the man would give it.

The man gave names to all the cattle, all the birds of heaven and all the wild beasts. But no helpmate suitable for man was found for him. So the Lord took one of his ribs and enclosed it in flesh. The Lord God built the rib he had taken from the man into a woman, and brought her to the man. The man exclaimed: "This at last is bone from my bones and flesh from my flesh! This is to be called woman, for this was taken from man." This is why a man leaves his father and mother and joins himself to his wife, and they become one body.

Second Reading: *Hebrews 2:9-11*

We see in Jesus one who was for a short while made lower than the angels and is now crowned with glory and splendour because he submitted to death; by God's grace he had to experience death for all mankind.

As it was his purpose to bring a great many of his sons into glory, it was appropriate that God, for whom everything exists and through whom everything exists, should make perfect, through suffering, the leader who would take them to their salvation. For the one who sanctifies, and the ones who are sanctified, are of the same stock; that is why he openly calls them brothers.

Gospel: *Mark 10:2-16*

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, "Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?" They were testing him. He answered them, "What did Moses command you?"

"Moses allowed us" they said "to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce." Then Jesus said to them, "It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide." Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them, "The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too." People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them.

The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them,; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." Then he put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing.
