
The Oratory Book Club, Tolle et Lege, will meet next on November 9th

The capital vices (continued): Lust and Its Opposite Virtue-Wholeness of Being

The essence of lust lies in the unrestrained and disordered quest for bodily gratification, driven by selfishness at the expense of one's own dignity and the dignity of others. Lust leads to a variety of sins. It is dangerous for the body but also for the soul, because it enslaves a person and destroys the ability to love. Tradition stresses the necessity of constantly struggling against this vice. "Whoever believes the body shall rise again is careful of his robe and defiles it not with impurity; but whoever disbelieves in the resurrection, gives himself over to impurity and misuses his body as though it were not his own." (St Cyril of Jerusalem) The virtue of

wholeness of being (chaste self-mastery) orders the sexual impulse through love of neighbour and of self, which restores the harmony body, soul and spirit.



Moses said to the people: "If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson.

Second Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28

Then there used to be a great number of those other priests, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him. To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day. as the other high priests do for their own sins and for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Gospel: Mark 12:28b-34

One of the scribes who had listened to them debating and had observed how well Jesus had answered them, now came up and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength.

The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God'. And after that no one dared to question him any more.
