Dear Parishioners,

Whereas Advent/Christmas focus on the Incarnation, birth and early manifestations of Christ, and Lent/Easter focuses on the great Paschal Mystery, the liturgical time into which we now enter (symbolised by the colour green) celebrates the overarching plan of God in all its aspects, as brought to fulfilment in the Person of the Lord Jesus. The Wisdom literature of the Old Testament serves as wonderful spiritual reading, reminding us to understand our lives in the prospect of eternity, knowing that both sinful pleasures and temporal success are fleeting, but the righteous who live by the Law of the Lord thereby gain an eternal standing. Let us be thankful that the gift of faith allows us to build up our lives on the solid foundation of God's Word.



This week's gospel reports the wedding at Cana. This is one of the two times Mary the Mother of Jesus is referred to as "woman", the other being just before Jesus dies on the cross. Tradition tells us this links back to the "woman" prophesied as the mother of the Messiah at the beginning of Genesis (3:15). An interesting scholarly addition to this is the counting of the references to days at the beginning of the gospel of John, as if they were new "days" of the new creation paralleling the Genesis "days" of creation. The Messiah who makes all things new, at the bidding of the woman prophesied in Genesis 3:15, inaugurates the miracles of the Kingdom he has entered into the world to establish.

"The way to God and the perfection demanded of us is shorter and more efficacious, markedly easier too, when one has learned, little by little, how to conserve, in all circumstances, a profound peace of heart. Because then the heart allows itself to be driven by the Holy Spirit, and God is able to do more with it by His grace than the heart could do by its own efforts.

God is a God of peace. He does not speak and does not operate except in peace, not in trouble and agitation. Our discussion is not an invitation to laziness and inaction. It is an invitation to act, sometimes considerably, under impulse of the Holy Spirit, not in a spirit of disquietude, agitation or excessive hurry."

First Reading: Isaiah 62:1-5

About Zion I will not be silent, about Jerusalem I will not grow weary, until her integrity shines out like the dawn and her salvation flames like a torch. The nations then will see your integrity, all the kings your glory, and you will be called by a new name, one which the mouth of the Lord will confer. You are to be a crown of splendour in the hand of the Lord, a princely diadem in the hand of your God; no longer are you to be named 'Forsaken', nor your land 'Abandoned', but you shall be called 'My Delight' and your land 'The Wedded'; for the Lord takes delight in you and your land will have its wedding. Second Reading: 1Corinthians 12:4-11

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given him by the Spirit; another may have the gift of preaching instruction given him by the same Spirit; and another the gift of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through this one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophecy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, who distributes different gifts to different people just as he chooses.

Gospel: John 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine'. Jesus said, 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you'. There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water', and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now. This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.
