Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity, Father Son and Holy Spirit, the central belief to which we hold in faith. It is a mystery which surpasses the powers of human reason to fathom, which is the principal reason why we stand in need of it being revealed to us. The fullness of this revelation has been given to us in Jesus the Christ, Son of the Living God (see Mt 16:18). At the Last Supper he said: "No one can come to the Father except through me....Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father" (Jn 14:6-9), and that anyone "who loves me will be loved by my Father." (Jn 14:21) We believe the revelation of the Lord Jesus because we believe he neither deceives nor can be deceived. Let us in these days renew our faith in him and in his word, and ask the Holy Spirit to strengthen our love of him, so that we might be loved also by the Father.

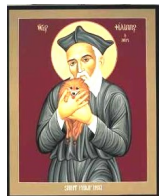
