The Fathers and Brothers of the Brisbane Oratory in formation would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to all who so generously gave of their time last Friday to pray for us. A special word of thanks is due to Stephen Glover, who co-ordinated the day. "More things are wrought by prayer than this world dreams of. Wherefore let thy voice rise like a fountain for me night and day." Among the daily prayers of the Oratory, one runs "Grant O Lord to all who do good to us, on account of Your Name, eternal life." May all our prayers for each other be granted.

This coming Thursday, August 15, is the great solemnity of the Assumption of Mary, Mother of God, soul and body into heaven. It is a holy day of obligation, and so our parish Mass times are: 7.00am [OF] Mary Immaculate, 6.00pm [OF] St John Fisher, 7.30pm [EF] Mary Immaculate.

It is a useful opportunity to be reminded of the elegant teaching of the Second Vatican Council on the Assumption: "Redeemed in a most exalted fashion, [Holy Mary is] endowed with the high office and dignity of Mother of the Son of God, [she is also] beloved daughter of the Father and Temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this sublime grace she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth...a wholly unique member of the Church, its type and outstanding model. [...] [I]n a wholly singular way she cooperated in the work of the Saviour of restoring supernatural life to souls. For this reason she is mother to us in the order of grace. This motherhood of Mary in the order of grace continues uninterruptedly from the consent she loyally gave at the Annunciation and which she sustained without wavering beneath the cross, until the eternal fulfilment of all the elect. Taken up to heaven she did not lay aside this saving office but by her manifold intercession continues to bring to us the gifts of eternal salvation." (Lumen gentium, 53,61, 62)

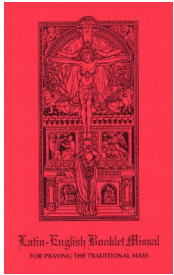

**Second Reading:** *Hebrews 11:1-2.8-12*

Only faith can guarantee the blessings that we hope for, or prove the existence of the realities that at present remain unseen. It was for faith that our ancestors were commended. It was by faith that Abraham obeyed the call to set out for a country that was the inheritance given to him and his descendants, and that he set out without knowing where he was going. By faith he arrived, as a foreigner, in the Promised Land, and lived there as if in a strange country, with Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. They lived there in tents while he looked forward to a city founded, designed and built by God. It was equally by faith that Sarah, in spite of being past the age, was made able to conceive, because she believed that he who had made the promise would be faithful to it. Because of this, there came from one man, and one who was already as good as dead himself, more descendants than could be counted, as many as the stars of heaven or the grains of sand on the seashore.

**Gospel: Luke 12:32-48**

Jesus said to his disciples: `There is no need to be afraid, little flock, for it has pleased your Father to give you the kingdom. `Sell your possessions and give alms. Get yourselves purses that do not wear out, treasure that will not fail you, in heaven where no thief can reach it and no moth destroy it. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

`See that you are dressed for action and have your lamps lit. Be like men waiting for their master to return from the wedding feast, ready to open the door as soon as he comes and knocks. Happy those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes. I tell you solemnly, he will put on an apron, sit them down at table and wait on them. It may be second watch he comes or in the third, but happy those servants if he finds them ready. You may be quite sure of this, that if the householder had known at what hour the burglar would come, he would not have let anyone break through the wall of his house. You too must stand ready, because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.' Peter said, `Lord, do you mean this parable for us, or for everyone? The Lord replied, `What sort of steward, then, is faithful and wise enough for the master to place him over his household to give them their allowance of food at the proper time? Happy that servant if his master's arrival finds him at this employment. I tell you truly, he will place him over everything he owns. But as for the servant who says to himself, "My master is taking his time coming", and sets about beating the menservants and the maids, and eating and drinking and getting drunk, his master will come on a day he does not expect and at an hour he does not know. The master will cut him off and send him to the same fate as the unfaithful. `The servant who knows what his master wants, but has not even started to carry out those wishes, will receive very many strokes of the lash. The one who did not know, but deserves to be beaten for what he has done, will receive fewer strokes. When a man has had a great deal given him, a great deal will be demanded of him; when a man has had a great deal given him on trust, even more will be expected of him.
